Youth Mental Health First Aid teaches **adults** how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental health and substance use challenges among children and youth. You'll build skills and confidence you need to reach out and provide initial support to young people who are struggling. You'll also learn how to help connect them to appropriate support. Plus, you'll receive a 3-year certification.
